### Tachikawa City Hall



Tachikawa City Hall opened for business on May 6, 2010. The building is an ecofriendly one that is environmentally conscious. The building features facilities utilizing natural energy, such as solar panels and ventilation towers, and gives consideration to the global environment through rooftop greening and the use of rainwater to reduce the use of air conditioning. In addition, due to the seismic isolation structure of the underground parking lot and the adoption of concrete, which leads to longer building life, the city hall is an example of a government building that has high durability against disasters.

## **Recommened Site**

#### Mt. Konpirayama and Konpira-jinja Shrine and Akibajinja Shrine



This mountain, said to have been made with earth and sand when digging the Tamagawa Aqueduct according to one theory, is about 10 meters high and is the only mountain in Tachikawa. Enshrined at the top is Konpira Daigongen and Asama-jinja Shrine. Enshrined halfway up is Akiba-jinja Shrine. Even today, the two gods Konpira and Akiba are taken care of carefully by people as protectors of the area. A festival is held in the fall of every year.

## Tachikawa City Cornerstone of Peace



The Cornerstone of Peace was erected in 1975 in commemoration of the 20th anniversary of the Sunagawa Struggle.

After the war, the US military was stationed in Tachikawa. In Tachikawa in 1955, an airfield expansion was requested for the purpose of jet bombers. However, the whole town's opposition movement to this at the time unfolded, which was called the Sunagawa Struggle. The extension of the runway was canceled in 1968 due to the extended opposition movement. The US military decided to relocate to Yokota Air Base the following year.
