This is a branch temple of Hase-dera Temple in Nara Prefecture that belongs to the Shingi Shingon Sect. Koshoji Temple was established by Chinkai in 1368. The temple houses a standing statue of Kanzeon Bosatsu (a designated cultural asset of Tokyo), a statue of the reclining Buddha, etc.





In the center of Kodara-dori street is Otsuka Farm, which has been operating since 1938. There is a total of about 50 head of dairy cow and beef cattle, along with various animals such as sheep, boars, silky fowl, and rabbits. It is like a small zoo. There is also a farm for picking blueberries in summer (from early July to around the end of August).

Q Recommended Site

Tenman-jinja Shrine



It is recorded in "Jinja Meisaicho (Registry of shrines)" that the shrine was established in 1694 by a jito (lord of a manor) named Shigemasa Denzaemon Amano. On the back of the sitting statue of goshintai (object of worship), the words "Goshintai was dedicated by Denzaemon Amano on February 29, 1694" are written in Indian ink, confirming the record of the registry. In 1936, Tobu-Ueno-sha Shrine and Inari-sha Shrine, Oheya-myojin Shrine, Dogaya-to-Suwa-sha Shrine, and Kasayato-shinmeisha Shrine were enshrined together.
